This year's competition asks you to create a written or artistic response to the following prompt:

It fills us with fresh courage and makes us strong again.”*
— Anne Frank

Writing Options: Poetry, Short Story, or Essay
Art Options: Painting, Drawing, or Photography

Rules

- Each student may submit one entry for consideration.
- All work should be original and done without the help of teachers or parents, outside of basic editing and construction assistance.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a completed entry form.
- Please follow your teacher’s instruction for how to submit your entry for a class assignment or extra credit.
- Projects submitted outside of a class must still have a teacher sponsor included on your registration form.

Guidelines

- Writing entries may not exceed 3 pages single spaced.
- Writing entries may only be submitted electronically as .doc or .docx files only.
- Art entries must be 2D and not exceed 18”x24”.
- If submitting artwork, you must also include a 150-200 word artist statement.
- Artwork must be submitted on black or white mat board.
- All entries sent by mail must be postmarked on or earlier than April 9, 2018.
- All entries will become property of the Holocaust Memorial Center.
- If you would like your artwork returned to you following the competition, you must call or email to make arrangements to pick it up during business hours prior to June 1, 2018.
