## Holocaust Memorial Center names Tim Constant as manager of education outreach

Tim Constant of Royal Oak has been named manager of education outreach at the [Holocaust Memorial Center](#) Zekelman Family Campus in Farmington Hills. This is a newly created position to engage Michigan school superintendents, principals and teachers in Holocaust and genocide education, following Governor Rick Snyder's signing of Revised School Code, House Bill 4493 into law which requires social studies curriculum about genocide, including the Holocaust, for students in grades 8 to 12. Rabbi Eli Mayerfeld, Holocaust Memorial Center CEO, announced the new position.



Constant's position was created to help with the new requirement, following Governor Rick Snyder's signing of Revised School Code, House Bill 4493 into law which requires social studies curriculum about genocide, including the Holocaust, for students in grades 8 to 12.

Constant previously served as principal at Crescent Academy in Southfield. Before that, he worked in leadership roles at the Hamtramck School District, including principal of Hamtramck High School. Constant had also served as the academic dean and Communication Arts department chairman at Cranbrook Educational Community.

Constant has a bachelor's of science degree in business administration; a master of science degree in finance at Walsh College and a master of arts degree in secondary education and teaching from the University of Michigan-Dearborn. He is currently pursuing a doctor of education degree at the University of Michigan-Dearborn.
