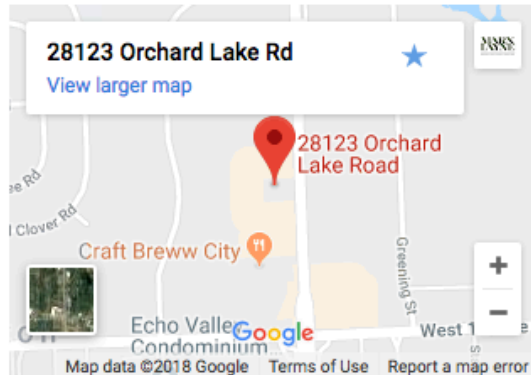

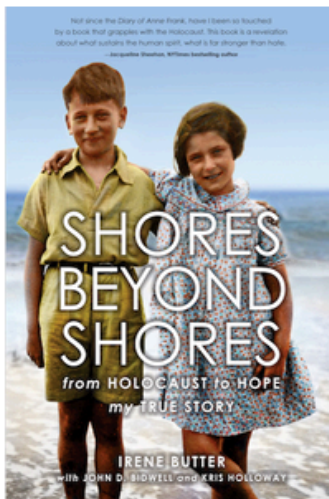

On Sun., June 3 at 3:15 p.m., the Holocaust Memorial Center Zekelman Family Campus is hosting Irene Butter who will speak about her new memoir, *Shores Beyond Shores: From Holocaust to Hope, My True Story*. The book is an account of how the heart keeps its common humanity in the most inhumane and turbulent of times. Irene's hard-earned lessons are a timeless inspiration.

When talking about her experience during World War II, Irene stresses the importance of "never a bystander" and that "one person can make a difference." Irene is a well-known peace activist, Holocaust survivor and Professor Emerita of Public Health at the University of Michigan.

The program includes Irene's talk about her memoir and a Q&A, followed by a book signing.
